Unfortunately, mountain safety is a subject we all tend to take for granted. After all, accidents only happen to the other guy!

Mountain safety seems to have hit a new low in these first nine months of 1967. Accidents or "near misses" are being reported in greater numbers, and the 100 Peaks Section is no exception. While trail carelessness and the resulting consequences may be a direct and positive approach to the population explosion, the adverse publicity and untold paperwork makes accident prevention a worthwhile goal.

The responsibility to prevent mishaps rests with outing leaders and participants alike. Unfortunately, some participants through ignorance or carelessness place themselves and others in jeopardy. For this reason, it is most important that trip leaders think ahead and anticipate problems. And I will be a second

At the start of an outing the leader should warn participants of possible problems or perils which may be encountered. It is equally important for the leaders to check and see that each and every participant is properly qualified and equipped to undertake the rigors presented by the outing. This particularly means that each person must have proper footwear, clothing, water, etc. Persons not meeting the minimum requirements should be turned back at the very start, regardless of how unpleasant the task may be. It is even more unpleasant to carry a body out! ROGER MITCHELL

PINOS, GROUSE, SAWMILL JUL 29 Leader: DON MC LELLAN, SR. Lorent Asst.: DON MC LELLAN, JR.

The leader's enthusiasm was not unbounded at the prospect of driving 200 miles round trip on the Golden State Freeway to lead a short hike during a midsummer heat wave. Furthermore, he felt the distance, the heat, and the fact that the Local Hikes Section had done the same hike two weeks brfore would keep attendance low. However, pleasant surprises were in store.

First was the attendance - come they did. The forty-five who signed in, in addition to the leaders, included many not usually seen on 100-Peaks hikes. We drove the mile to Pinos, assembled there, and at 9:55 started for Sawmill, behind Don Jr. This involved a descent of 500 feet to a saddle and then a gradual climb of 400 feet along the ridge to Sawmill, a distance of two miles, which the last hiker reached at 10:50 after one turned back.

The second surprise was the moderate temperature. At the start the temperature was pleasant and later a cloud cover kept it that way. In addition, a profusion of blooming flowers created very pleasant hiking conditions.

Four dropped out at Sawmill. The rest continued on the one mile slow descent, then 250 foot climb to Grouse, our scheduled destination, which all reached by 11:30. We ate lunch on Grouse.

Some wanted to continue further along the trail to Cerro Noroeste. Tom Wade agreed to lead those who wanted to continue while the leader decided he would return with the main group. However, when the Cerro Noroeste party departed, the leader received another major surprise when he realized that all except eight were heading for that peak. He quickly changed plans and ran after his departing, high spirited "followers" leaving Don Jr. and Dick McLellan to lead the eight back -- which they did without mishap.

The hike to Cerro Noroeste was an additional 2 miles. The good trail descends 1,000 feet to a saddle then rises 650 feet. Tom led ably and everyone reached the top by 1:15, but don't tell them Cerro Noroeste is considered a drive-up! 1

A few remained behind at the top to wait for their drivers to pick them up later. The others started back about 1:45 behind the leader, who attempted to regain some lost dignity by leading again. The last group back to Pinos included five-year-old Chuck Hines. He looked very weary, but gamely trudged along, sinking to the trail occasionally, helped by the verbal encouragement of accompanying adults. He reached the cars at 4:40 and looked ready for a long nap. Looks as if he'll have his 200 peak bar by the time he can join the Club. For us senior citizens it was a very enjoyable summer day. Weldon was an ardent conservationist and was active in mountaineering through the Sierra Club and the American Alpine Club.

Those of us involved in 100 Peaks will remember him best as a founder of our Section.

This hike was to provide an easy route to a different peak. A long downhill route out was planned to permit a maximum exposure to the area with a minimum of effort. That was the plan; now here is what happened!

The Williams Canyon route had been scouted on April 23. The trail is very faint. overgrown, and completely eroded away in some areas. It 'joins the Cow Canyon firebreak, and continues northwest to the summit. This route was too much for an August hike because of its approximately 4,600 foot elevation gain. I looked for an approach through Bichota Canyon, and found a fire road that climbed to about 4,800 foot elevation and to within three miles of Pattleanake Peak. The Forest Service assured me that this road was open to the public all summer, but we were prevented from scouting this route by the slide closure of the main road. After the slide had been cleared and the road opened, we were blocked from Bichota Canyon because the Highway Department was rerouting the main road and had clobbered the Bichota Canyon entrance. The road was chained shut. The District Manager offered to let us in, but warned me about the poor condition of the road. He advised me to wait till the road was repaired, but not to worry because the route to the peak was a good one. He also suggested that we take the firebreak along the ridge instead of Williams Canyon to avoid brush and snakes. When I reminded him that this would be in fire closure, he indicated that he could get us a special permit. It sounded like a clean operation, so I submitted my write-up. We did make one more attempt to scout on August 5th before I: on vacation, but in spite of everything we were unable to find a passable route for cars through the river at that time. So-o-o-o-o, on to the hike! After arranging the car shuttle between Cow Canyon and Bichota Canyon, we got the ranger to unlock the chain and we were on our way. After fording the stream we continued up a very smoothly graded dirt road for about 4.7 miles to a heliport at the 4,800 foot level. Then we first saw our route. The hill was indented with guilles which were filled with dense brush. To avoid them we had to go much higher than we had intended. The steep climb through brush in the intense heat took its toll early. We reached the firebreak at the time I had hoped to be on the summit. The firebreak is pure fiction. It is completely overgrown, and it was an almost continuous bushwhack to the summit. And from the summit down to Cow Canyon! The strengters reached the summit at 4:15 p.m. About a quarter mile south of the summit, one hiker finally gave up completely. We had been making many stops for her because of leg cramps and general exhaustion. Her husband agreed that she couldn't keep up with us and that they would drop out of the group and wait for help. We left them at 4:45 p.m. with some of our precious water and salt tablets.

The firebreak route out proved to be no bargain. There were a number of hills to climb over which we could have avoided by going down Williams Canyon. The brush on the firebreak was as bad as in the canyon. The final descent toward the river was made by climbing and sliding down a steep slope by flashlight. It was about 10:30 p.m. when we waded across the river toward the rangers who had been waiting for us. The rather obvious conclusion is that there is still no easy way to bag. Rattlesnake Peak. And even downhill hiking through brush and heat can be very rough. Spring is definitely the time for hiking this area, even in a foot or two of show.

I reported the two hikers we had left near the summit to the East Fork Ranger Station and pinpointed their location on the topo. They decided to initiate rescue operations immediately. Ken Ferrell then drove all the drivers back up Bichota Canyon in Fred Bodes VW bus to complete the shuttle. Shortly after midnight we were merrily on our way down when the lead car found the only mud hole on the mountain and dropped the right front wheel in over the hub! We couldn't get past him, so we attempted a lot of digging, pushing, towing, and general wheel spinning before we gave up and the driver went to get help. The rest of us tried for some sleep, but he returned very quickly with a Sheriff's and a Forest Service truck. They had been on their way up to see why we were delayed. After they towed out the stuck car, we drove down to pick up the passengers who were waiting at Rincon Station. But we had one more appointment at East Fork Station. At 4:30 a.m. we finally left for home after being informed by the Sheriff's Department that rescue teams had reached the hikers and that they would wait till morning to fly them out. It had been a long day!
